

SUGGESTIONS FOR FURTHER READING



Can Iran be prevented from obtaining nuclear weapons by sanctions, or ultimately will it require preemptive military action? If Iran becomes nuclear, can it be contained?

Two recent collections of essays explore the history of Iran's nuclear program and the international community's responses to it. The first is *Iran: The Nuclear Challenge*, edited by Robert D. Blackwill (Council on Foreign Relations Press, 2012), and the second is *Iran and the Bomb: Solving the Persian Puzzle*, edited by Gideon Rose and Jonathan Tepperman (Council on Foreign Relations Press, 2012). Both works shed light on the complexities of this issue and will assist readers in the development of policy.
