The holder of a Ph.D. in political science from the University of Iowa, he has written numerous books, including *Revolving Gridlock: Politics and Policy from Carter to Clinton* (1999), with Craig Volden, and *Critical Elections and Congressional Policy Making* (1988). He has served as an associate dean in the Stanford Graduate School of Business and received the Dinkelspiel Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Teaching from Stanford in 1992. He is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and has been a Hoover fellow since 1989.
