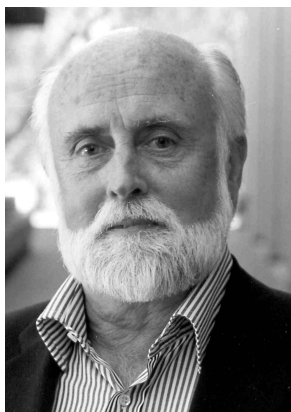


KENNETH JOWITT

A Hoover fellow since 1998, Kenneth Jowitt is a professor emeritus of political science at the University of California, Berkeley, where he also received his Ph.D. The recipient of the university's Distinguished Teaching Award in 1983 and 1995, he is a frequent guest lecturer at other universities and in business, civic, and governmental settings. He has also appeared on *Hardball*, Chris Matthews's television news program. In 1998, Jowitt was the Jean Monnet Visiting Scholar at the European University in Florence, Italy, as well the featured speaker in the Princeton University Lecture series. His latest book is *New World Disorder: The Leninist Extinction* (1992). Some of his other publications include "Challenging the Correct Line," *East European Politics and Society* (fall 1998), and "Rogue Males at Work," *Times Literary Supplement* (February 1998).
