He has served as president of both the American Sociological Association and the American Political Science Association (the only person to do so), in addition to serving as president of a number of other professional societies. The holder of a Ph.D. in sociology from Columbia University, he is a fellow of the American Philosophical Society, the National Academy of Sciences, the National Academy of Arts and Sciences, and the National Academy of Education.
