In addition to her Hoover appointment, Guity Nashat is a member of the history faculty at the University of Illinois at Chicago. The holder of a Ph.D. in history from the University of Chicago, she is the editor of two forthcoming books on women in Iran, extending from medieval times to the Islamic Republic. She is also the author of *The Origins of Modern Reform in Iran, 1970–1880* (1982) and *Women and Revolution in Iran* (1984). Her most recent work, with Hoover fellow Gary Becker, is *The Economics of Life* (1997). Since 1992, she has been a member of the editorial advisory board of *World Civilization*. She participated in the World Economic Forum at Davos, Switzerland, and in New York (2001).
