The holder of a Ph.D. in economics from the University of California, Los Angeles, John Raisian has been a Hoover fellow since 1986 and director of the Hoover Institution since 1989. He was a member of the economics faculties at the University of Washington and the University of Houston, where he received a distinguished teaching award. He also served as special assistant for economic policy and director of research and technical support in the U.S. Department of Labor during the first term of the Reagan administration, where he received the Distinguished Service Award. At the end of his service in Washington, he served as executive director of the President's Task Force on Food Assistance, a six-month assignment investigating the adequacy and efficiency of the nation's food assistance programs. Before joining the Hoover Institution, he was president of an economic consulting company in Los Angeles. His current research interests include the application of economic principles to public policy formation, the appropriate role of government in society, and the importance of human capital accumulation for productivity growth and economic prosperity.
