The holder of a Ph.D. in economics from Harvard University, Rita Ricardo-Campbell is the author or coeditor of a number of books including *Social Security: Promise and Reality* (1977); *The Economics and Politics of Health* (1982); with Hoover fellow Edward Lazear, *Issues in Contemporary Retirement* (1988); and *Resisting Hostile Takeovers: The Case of Gillette* (1997). She was a member of the President's Economic Policy Advisory Board, 1981–89; the National Council on the Humanities, 1982–88; and the President's Committee on the National Medal of Science, 1988–2000. From 1967 to 1975, she was a California commissioner of the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education, which she chaired in 1970–71. She served on the president's Health Service Industry Committee, 1971–74, and was a member of the Advisory Council on Social Security, 1974–75. From 1978 to 1990, she was a director of Gillette.
