A Hoover fellow since 1994, Shelby Steele has written widely on race in American society and the consequences of contemporary social programs on race relations. His most recent book is *A Dream Deferred: The Second Betrayal of Black Freedom in America* (1999). He received the National Book Critic's Circle Award in 1990 in the general nonfiction category for his book *The Content of Our Character: A New Vision of Race in America* (1990). He has also written extensively for major publications including the *New York Times* and the *Wall Street Journal*. The holder of a Ph.D. in English from the University of Utah, he is also a contributing editor at *Harper's* magazine. In 1991, his work on the documentary *Seven Days in Bensonhurst* was recognized with an Emmy Award, the Writers Guild of America Award for Documentary, and the San Francisco Film Festival Award for Documentary Writing.
